On May 29, 2008, representatives from the Alliance for Telecommunications Industry Solutions ("ATIS") Incubator Solutions Program #4 - Hearing Aid Compatibility ("AISP.4-HAC") met with representatives from the Federal Communications Commission's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau ("WTB"). The purpose of the meeting was to make the FCC aware that the wireless industry and advocates representing consumers with hearing loss have reached consensus on a general set of principles addressing hearing aid compatibility of handsets with multiple frequency bands and/or modes for which no HAC standard exists.
