

Re: Changes to Toll-Free Number Administration System CC Docket No. 95-155

Dear Ms. Attwood:

On December 7, 2000, the Chief of the Network Services Division sent a letter to the President of DSMI ("Keller-Wade Letter," DA 00-2754) directing that certain changes be made to the Disconnect Status and Suspend Status functions of the SMS/800 database in order to address alleged problems with slamming and number brokering. On June 22, 2000, the Bureau released a Public Notice (DA 01-1463) seeking comments on a petition filed by AT&T seeking clarification of the FCC's toll-free regulations and other matters related to the *Keller-Wade Letter*. On July 13, 2001, the Commission issued a Public Notice (DA 01-1677) extending the deadline for complying with the *Keller-Wade Letter* "until the Bureau resolves the outstanding issues raised in the June Public Notice or until December 8, 2001, the industry-proposed deadline, whichever comes first."

When the Commission released its Public Notice on June 22, 2001. requesting comments from the industry, the SNAC and the SMT postponed actual work on design and development related activities. The industry strongly urges the Commission to undertake a thorough review of the Commission's Order modifying the SMS/800 Disconnect and Suspend Status functions. We also appeal to the Commission to adopt a well thought-out, pragmatic and workable approach concerning the transfer of toll-free numbers between subscribers, based on comments filed in response to the June Public Notice. Until the Commission has an opportunity to complete its review, it will be a wasteful expenditure of limited resources to proceed with undefined development and implementation of the changes mandated by the Keller-Wade Letter, and subsequent changes requested by the SNAC. Therefore, ATIS/SNAC requests that the Commission rescind the December 8, 2001 compliance date, and direct the industry to defer all implementation work pending a decision in CC Docket 95-155/NSD File No. L-01-112.

If, based on the record in that proceeding, the Commission decides to go forward with the *Keller-Wade Letter*, a new compliance date of 6 to 8 months after the release of that order may be set.

The SNAC acknowledges that it did request deferral of the compliance date to December 8, 2001. However, this request was made prior to the release of the June Public Notice, and the requested December date required a finalized design by mid-June 2001. The finalized design date has now been postponed. As a result, the industry can no longer meet the December 8, 2001 date.

The SNAC looks forward to a final resolution from the Commission so that the industry can resume implementation activities.
